EUROPEAN CITIES AND METROPOLIS

In the post-war period, proposals for a regional approach to the Milan area have stalled in the face of governance difficulties. A truly polycentric vision, able to organize and integrate landscapes in the image of the city begins to emerge only in the most recent phases: the strategic framework for municipal planning policies "Rebuilding the Greater Milan" (Luigi Mazza, 2000) was a first step in this direction; a trend confirmed by the recent Piano di Governo del Territorio (Metrogramma, 2010) which featured a new vision for Milan as a "reticular city from Ticino to Adda" outlining strategies for overcoming the radial model of the city.

Dareterra's focus is to progressively better match demand and results of scientific research with the aim of being able to act usefully in developing world countries, where explosive growth and the depopulation of the rural areas determine the cancellation of cultural and environmental knowledge. In particular, the metropolitan city of towns in Nigeria, the energies and the territorial transformation of Palma / Pemba in Mozambique, the in-sustainability of the informal city of Cairo and Heliopolis, the explosive growth of Dar es Salaam will be presented and analyzed by the researchers, the actors of local institutions and companies that operate in those territories.

Since the 2013 edition, Dareterra will set up a permanent observatory on some African cities (Dar, Pemba, Cairo, Nigerian Network of medium-sized cities) which will gain form by continuous and organized reports, research and communication.
